To view past versions of a map or discover how images have changed over time in Google Earth, first open the app on your device and search for a place. You can then either click Historical imagery in the toolbar or View Historical Imagery to enable this feature. To use it, you need to switch from the Map basemap to the Satellite. Once enabled, select how you want to view the map by clicking at the top left to turn on historical imagery or timelapse. A timeline appears at the top right of your screen. You can explore the map over time by clicking on a specific year in the timeline or using the Previous and Next buttons. To lock the latest imagery, click Last page, but be aware that you won't be able to minimize the historical imagery toolbar unless you first collapse it. When navigating through the map, note that smaller dots represent additional months for each year, and image availability is represented on a slider. Satellite image coverage may change as you explore, and years marked by dots indicate global coverage variations.
